AK5 Letter Names

Letter Critter

Benchmarks: A.2a, F.3a, F.3b, G.2a, G.3a



Objective

The child will identify and order the letters of the alphabet.



Materials

- Critter Head and Uppercase Letter Cards (Activity Master)
- Dry Erase markers and erasers
- Extension: Critter Head and Lowercase Letter Cards (Activity Master)



Activity


After teacher introduction, children alphabetize uppercase letters and write corresponding lowercase letters.

- 1. Scatter rectangles face up on a flat surface. Provide children with a dry erase marker.
- 2. Working in pairs, children place rectangles in alphabetical order while naming each letter, to create the letter critter.
- 3. Label the bottom of the rectangles with corresponding lowercase letters using a dry erase marker.
- 4. Continue until all uppercase letters have corresponding lowercase letters.
- 5. Peer evaluation.
- 6. Teacher evaluation




Adaptations and Extensions

- Start with only a few letters, such as A-G. Add more letters as they are introduced in class.
- Practice writing the uppercase letters to match the critter.
- Point to letters randomly while partner says sound.
- Use pictures and sort by initial or final sounds.
- As a letter is named, say a word that begins with that letter. (e.g., C is for cat.)



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


